Sturgeon County region residents are welcome to take home nutrient-rich compost — at no cost — from Roseridge's Community Resource Zone. It's a simple way to improve your soil and reduce waste.

Accessing Roseridge Re-Source Compost

- ◆ You do not need to go over the scale to access the compost giveaway area, as it is located before the scale.
- ◆ Residents may self-load during Roseridge's regular hours of operation.
- ◆ Please bring your own container and shovel for collection.

Sharing the Resource

- ◆ Compost is available for free, but please be mindful and take only what you need so there is enough for others.
- ◆ While there is no set limit, this program is intended for home garden use, not large-scale removal.

How to Use Re-Source Compost Effectively

- ◆ Compost is a nutrient-rich soil amendment that enhances plant growth and soil structure.
- ◆ Use a little, not a lot: Compost acts as a slow-release fertilizer, meaning a small amount goes a long way.
- ◆ Recommended ratio: Mix 1 part compost with 3 parts soil for best results.
- ◆ Do not plant directly into pure compost— always blend it with soil.
- ◆ For topdressing or mulching, spread a thin layer of compost around plants, lawns, or garden beds. Over time, it will integrate into the soil, enriching it naturally.
